In decision WMPCC 17/2022 the Commissioner proposed the appointment of Mr Craig Guildford as Chief Constable.

Following consideration of the proposed appointment by West Midlands Police and Crime Panel on 25 July 2022, the Panel agreed unanimously to recommend the Police and Crime Commissioner's preferred candidate Mr Craig Guildford be appointed as West Midlands Police Chief Constable

INTRODUCTION AND BACKGROUND

- Decision <u>WMPCC 17/2022</u>, included details of the process for the appointment of a Chief Constable for West Midlands Police. The appointment of a Chief Constable is a matter for the Commissioner.
- Reports were submitted to the West Midlands Police and Crime Panel on 25 July 2022, in support of the consideration of Mr Craig Guildford as the proposed appointment. These were published on the Panel's website: <u>Police and Crime</u> <u>Panel report</u>
- 3. The Panel recommended the appointment of Mr Guildford and was satisfied that the selection process was open, fair and transparent. The Panel's report to the Commissioner to this effect, is at Appendix 1.
- 4. Mr Guildford will commence his duties as Chief Constable on 5 December 2022, upon the retirement of the current Chief Constable.

FINANCIAL IMPLICATIONS

5. Salary and other costs are met from the agreed budget for West Midlands Police.

LEGAL IMPLICATIONS

- 6. Schedule 2 of the Police Reform and Social Responsibility Act 2011, requires Police and Crime Commissioners to appoint a Chief Constable.
- 7. Both Police and Crime Commissioners and Chief Constables are classed by the Elected Local Policing Bodies Specified Information Order 2011 (as amended) as senior appointments, thereby requiring the publication of job title, responsibilities, salary and name of post holder.
