2.	UPDATE on stop and search data from Inspector Graham	The pack has been emailed to all panel members in advance so it can be pre read and save a little time in the meeting. If panel members have any questions they can raise them at the time.
		It as noted that the % of Meeting the Required standard for the NPU and the Impact Areas is on a downward trajectory.
		MS asked about whether the BE NPU knife find rate was related to specific programs being implemented in these wards.
		AK asked about how long the memory in a BWV device lasts for. SG said until its battery runs out.
		The panel noted the disproportionally ratios in the data and will keep these under review.
		NH asked about the frequency of handcuffing when undertaking a Stop & Search. At the moment over half of these interactions result in the nominal being handcuffed.

Why was it declined as not making the standard?

As requested by the panel all five videos related to non compliant handcuffing.

Record 2 chosen by MS


There was an eight day sign off for the handcuffed search undertaken by a Motorway unit. A number of officers were present in a car sales lot. The nominal was very vocal and agitated. The panel felt that the officer remained calm and professional in the face of a difficult situation. Agreed that this was a positive Stop & Search and use of handcuffing.

Initiate a Praise & Reward.

Record 5 chosen by NH

The nominal was handcuffed to the front using two handcuffs. Through out a difficult incident around the said and rear of a house the officer used a professional and appropriate tone, explaining what was happening and what would happen. The nominal was treated with and shown appropriate care at all times. The panel agreed that this was a neutral use of handcuffing.

KE asked about the difference between drawn and aimed when reporting on the use of a Taser.
