1.	Welcome and introduction Minutes of the last meeting, update on any actions taken from last meeting	Minutes from the last meeting in January 2023 were discussed by attendees.	
	any actions taken from last meeting	Action updates: Vehicle stopped due to occupants wearing balaclavas and gloves. Officers felt they could be involved in theft due to clothing. Class A drugs found in car.	
		Panel view: panel felt that officer used his GOWISELY perfectly. Officer explained everything in detail to the nominals. Officer identified himself which the panel were impressed with. Action update: Positive feedback provided to officer.	
		4. reports that victim had been attacked with a machete. Offender had fled scene. Victim found in possession of a screwdriver. Panel views: Panel felt that it was conducted well by officers. Officer showed great compassion towards an obviously frightened youth. Officers were calm and polite. Panel felt that officers did well in explaining the realities of carrying a weapon. Action update: Positive feedback provided to officers.	
		Reported that 2 males were using counterfeit money in a shop. Positively identified by staff as they were repeat offenders. One male ran. Didn't comply with handcuffing. Baton used.	



	Panel views: panel felt that the student officer was put in a very dangerous situation by colleague, which could have been prevented if they had communicated better. Officers constant
	language was inappropriate. Action update: The officer's supervisors
	are in agreement that although under pressure in a volatile situation, this was not appropriate language and appropriate advice and learning completed with the officer.
	This was the same incident as above but footage from another officers BWF.
	Panel views: Panel thought the use of PAVA was not needed. Officer started at such a hostile level towards the nominal and it made the situation worse.
	Action update: This has been reviewed in full by two sergeants supervising the officer and the officers spoken to. Full review has come to the conclusion that the use of PAVA was justified but the officer has been given advice and learning over the language and use of tactical communication. This will be kept under review by the supervisors.

Action: positive feedback to officers.

5.) son was having a mental health crisis. Mother was unable to cope and wanted him removed from the property. Panel did not watch the conversation officers had with the mother before going to remove the son.

Panel views: panel understood that officers tried to do the right thing by the mother, but could have spent more time speaking to him to try and get a calmer outcome. Panel recognised that the environment and situation was difficult but they did escalate the situation.

Officers should have communicated



		with the individual to explain the process.
		Action: MB to have conversation with officers to discuss the thought process. MB to view footage of the conversation with the mother to understand if there was a reason officers used the force they did. MB to update panel at next meeting
