Dear FOI Applicant

Thank you for your freedom of information request received in this office on **19 August 2025** in which you asked:

'We are the researching arm of Common Legal Circle, an alternative business solution elect entity.

For the purpose of this correspondence, we are concerned with the aforementioned matter, with the specific aim of impregnating an instrument, namely the Bill of Indictment (BOI) Segregate Mala-Fide Operative Keystone Elemental Defect(s) (SMOKED) Diagnostic Tool (BSDT), as Standard Issue Instrument of Probe (IOP) into the British Criminal Justice System, for the purpose to assist self represent convicted defendants in mounting a meritorious application for appeal against conviction.

As its name suggests, the aim of the BSDT centres on any defects as to be potentially found within the fabric of a given BOI. The preamble within the BSDT should provide you with a concise understanding of the scope of the diagnostic nature of the BSDT.

In its inaugural application, we seek to apply the BSDT to the matter of:

Regina v H Rhoad & S N Iamnoto – Case No: T20197484

- 1) How many Companies are listed on the Bill of Indictment (BOI)?*
- 2) What are the names of each Company identified in response to Question 1?*
- 3) What is the reason for the inclusion of each company on the BOI, as identified in response to Question 2?*

Freedom of Information Right of Appeal

All requests for review will be recorded. Receipt of a request for internal review will be acknowledged and the appellant informed of an estimated date for determining the outcome. The OPCC will attempt to respond to internal reviews as soon as practicable and in any case within two months.

The result of any internal review will be communicated to the appellant outlining the decisions taken.
