Dear FOI Applicant,

Thank you for your freedom of information request received in this office on **6 March** and **7 March** 2026 in which you asked:

'I would like to request the following information regarding speed enforcement on Eachelhurst Road:

- 1. The number of speeding notices or tickets issued on Eachelhurst Road on 30 January 2026.*
- 2. The number of speeding notices issued on the same road during the period of one week prior to that date and one week after (23 January 2026 – 6 February 2026).*
- 3. Of those issued notices during that period, how many recipients stated that they believed the road to have a 40 mph speed limit or similar.*
- 4. Of the individuals who gave that explanation, how many were subsequently:
- prosecuted or issued penalties; and
- not prosecuted or not issued any penalties.*
- 5. Of the cases where no prosecution or penalty was issued, please confirm whether any equality or demographic monitoring information is recorded in relation to those outcomes.*

AND

- 1. Of those issued notices during the period previously mentioned (23 January 2026 – 6 February 2026) who were recorded travelling at 43 mph or above, how many were offered a Speed Awareness Course as opposed to receiving the penalty of three points on their driving licence (irrespective of any associated financial penalties)?*
- 2. In cases where a Speed Awareness Course was offered, please confirm whether any equality or demographic monitoring information is recorded in relation to those outcomes.'*

In response to your request, I can confirm that the Office of the Police and Crime Commissioner (OPCC) does not hold this information. However, this information may be held by West Midlands Police.

Freedom of Information Right of Appeal

All requests for review will be recorded. Receipt of a request for internal review will be acknowledged and the appellant informed of an estimated date for determining the outcome. The OPCC will attempt to respond to internal reviews as soon as practicable and in any case within two months.

All investigations will be undertaken by someone not involved in the original response.

The result of any internal review will be communicated to the appellant outlining the decisions taken.
